Staffing News

Movement Group

I am pleased to be able to inform parents that Mrs Hirschman will be continuing with Movement Group on Wednesday and Friday mornings, whilst Mrs Mealyou-Went has agreed to take Movement Group on Monday and Tuesday. Movement Group will, therefore, continue at the same time on each week day except Thursday. Children will be collected from the main Office entrance at 8.30am on these mornings.

Breakfast Club

The staff in Breakfast Club have asked me to remind parents that they really need 24 hours' notice if you would like to book your child into Breakfast Club. On increasing occasions, parents are bringing children to Breakfast Club without any notice and expecting staff to take them. This should only happen very rarely, in exceptional circumstances. This is not the case at the moment, which is making it very difficult for staff with regard to staffing ratios and planning appropriate activities.

In addition, children who arrive after 8.30am will only be able to access cereals and a drink for breakfast as most of the choices will have been cleared away by this time and most of the other children and staff will be involved in activities.
